

## RISK ASSESSMENT – WOODLAND SKILLS (TOOLS AND FIRE)



Group ratios: 1 instructor per group plus – 1 supervising adult to 4 Brownies or 1 supervising adult to 6 Guides or Rangers

Supervising adults should not participate in the activity.

An adult with the group should be responsible for First Aid.

The Emergency Muster Point is by the Car Park.

Please report all Accidents or Near Misses in an Accident Book, which are located in the Solid Shelter or in phone cupboard in Foyer of House.

A First-Aid kit can also be found in the Solid Shelter.

Cuts or stab wounds resulting from knife and/or saw use	Participants	<ul> <li>All instructors will be appropriately trained and can demonstrate suitable levels of skill</li> <li>Participants will receive appropriate instruction</li> <li>Maintain designated supervision ratios</li> <li>Maintain suitable safe working distance from other participants (3-5m)</li> <li>Always adopt a safe stance and use appropriate knife/saw holds</li> <li>Never use knives while standing</li> <li>All tools to be kept sharp and in good working order</li> <li>When not in use return all tools to their protective sheaths/covers/boxes</li> <li>When not in use folding saws must be closed</li> <li>At the end of each session all tools must be accounted for and placed in the tool box which then locked in a cupboard</li> </ul>

Air-borne hot ash and embers		<ul> <li>Provide gloves for use with hot Billy cans</li> <li>Buckets of water must be available at all fire bases for firefighting, first aid of burns and to douse the fire at the end of the session</li> </ul>
