

ARCHERY GB INSTRUCTOR AWARD

The course provides training that is focussed on teaching short taster sessions such as those delivered in activity centres; it is predominantly practical in nature and uses professional learning resources to help train candidates.

What does the course for instructors cover?

- Establishing and maintaining safety on a range
- Using a session plan to prepare and deliver a session
- Identifying appropriate equipment for beginners to use
- Explaining / demonstrating the simple steps to shooting barebow
- Using engagement, variety and challenge to make sessions fun
- Adapting sessions based on the individual needs of participants

Who is the course for?

- Outdoor instructors
- Teachers
- New or inexperienced archers

How long does the course take?

 The award takes 2 days to complete (approximately 2 days of training including an external assessment)

Outcomes of the course and renewals

- Upon successful completion of the course, candidates will be awarded a certificate of achievement and become an Archery GB-qualified Instructor.
- To keep the qualification valid, every three years candidates will need to complete a short online renewal process. This demonstrates that they understand minimum safety requirements for instructing archery.

Meals: Help-yourself hot and cold drinks and biscuits will be available throughout but no other food. Please bring a packed lunch, or there is a local shop about 1 mile away.

Accommodation: The course is non-residential but if you bring a sleeping bag you may stay over at no extra charge (there is a fridge, kettle, microwave and toaster) or there is a Premier Inn and other hotels in Newmarket, to be paid for at your own expense.

Kit: Warm and waterproof outdoor gear, indoor and outdoor shoes, notebook and pen. You should not bring any archery equipment.

Fee: The course fee is £230 which includes tuition and assessment fees plus drinks and biscuits. If you become an instructor for the Jarman Centre and run a minimum of 3 sessions during 2024 we will refund £50 of your course fees. You may be able to apply for grant funding, eg (for Girlguiding Cambridgeshire East leaders) from county or region, to help you attend this training.
